New Truck:

28-391 – few pictures have been sent. Truck has been re-located to South Dakota; tork box and ladder in production. Possible completion last week of July; manufacturer asked if the truck cold go to Wildwood if ready.

28-396 Super Pumper – start of construction estimated for July/August with anticipated completion date of April, 2025.

Equipment:

Bail out training, train the trainer, has been completed; will schedule department training; need 20 additional bail out system sets at a cost of 7,303.00 will come out of PPE budget, Robert Holmes motioned to approve, Robert Cromer seconded, roll call vote, all in favor; have to spend matching amount for grant. Grant should be released soon. There was discussion on the process of the \$34,000 matching grant. John Boyle, Jr. motioned to purchase 7 sets of gear once grant is released, Robert Holmes seconded, roll call vote, all in favor; working on another grant.

Local Board of Finance approved application for financing; officially under contract with Skye Co, contracts have been signed. Matt Jessup working on Resolution Authorizing going to bond for 3.5 million dollars.

Gas company disconnected service, letter was sent for disconnect, once letter in hand, township will release demo permit, plan is to take down the building next week.

Discussion on hold up of release of permits with the township, would like to reach out to Mayor for help on partial release of permits.

Site improvement – some quotes back, township recommended a site improvement company for water, quote is \$174,000.00 for water utility box and hydrant, 2 inch domestic water, taken up to the building; SkyeCo takes over at building. Attorney Sendzik advised would need to go out to bid. Discussion on change orders, and possibility of meeting or exceed Cap of 20% of contract price.
